86 REPORTS FOR OTHER BODIES

Cllr Roberts reported about the issue with the Land Ownership at the far end of Joey the Swan. The land and Carpark where the persistent fly tipping keeps taking place is not owned by the Parish Council, There was a compulsory Purchase Order put in by Crewe and Nantwich Borough Council as the owners had let the land go derelict. Nothing seemed to happen after the compulsory Purchase Order and the land is still registered to the previous owners. Councillor Roberts and Moore and the previous clerk have tried in the past to resolve this situation with Cheshire East as the Parish Council are paying the costs for the maintenance of this land.

It was **AGREED** that the Clerk will try and pursue the matter again with Cheshire East and try to arrange a meeting with them to get the Land ownership resolved and come up with a care plan for the land.

Cllr Kilkenny reported that a copy of the Cricket Club lease has been sent to the Clerk and it will be included at our next meeting for Council's approval, he also reported that United Utilities had given the go ahead for the drainage work so the project is moving forward.

87 ENVIRONMENTAL REPORT

The Environmental Reports from the Park Ranger was received by the Council and accepted. The Clerk will get establish which signs are broken and obtain a quotation for replacement. The Clerk has reported the fly tipping to Guiness Housing and the blockages on the stream. The Ranger was going to speak to someone from the Conservation Group with regards to the swinging gate repairs.
