70 REPORTS FROM OTHER BODIES

Cllr Squirrell reported that the WSLA were contacting Lynne Thornton to liaise with other landowners' solicitors with regard to the drainage pipe crossing their land. WSLA have asked the school to cut back some trees to improve the street lighting. WSLA's loan repayments were on track. Problems with the school's contractors parking at the Brittles were being resolved.

Cllr Moore reported that the Community Council members were down to 12, and they were trying to attract new members.

There were problems with restrictions with regard to the parades for the Firework Display and Village Fete, so the parades will probably have to be cancelled. Also, there were problems getting an agreement with the school to use their field for the fete, so alternative locations may have to be considered.
